Your Submission:	I am in support of the proposal to extend the tram route through city mall and up round Manchester Street. The extension will link the tram with more of Christchurch's top hotels, plus the extension will provide an opportunity to highlight more of Christchurch's inner city history, including the Bridge of Remembrance, the Ballantynes fire and department store, as well as other hidden gems. This would act very similar to the double-decker tourist bus tours that operate successfully in places like London and Edinburgh.
