It will help us if in your submission you clearly state your opinion on the proposed route and describe/outline any ideas/issues you may have.

① I strongly support this proposed tram route extension - for the benefits of enhanced visitor access to additional areas of the city and for the "ambiance" it will bring to the southern and eastern parts of the inner city. This proposal enhances the role of the trams as "icons" of our city.

② I believe the line should continue along High St and service the Catholic Cathedral and other destinations in the area. The cathedral has considerable tourist interest and high heritage value.

③ Heritage tramcars should be used on this extension - failure to do so undermines the iconic status of the city tramway.

④ Track foundations and rails should be laid as City Mall work proceeds - to do otherwise involves needless expense.

⑤ Cost analysis needs to be done before this project proceeds. No projections indicating viability have yet been published!
