**Hampshire Street – Flooding remedial work or Living Streets – upgrade**

We understand and support the proposed work that is to take place on Hampshire Street, we also request that further funding be made available for the living streets concept to continue further down Hampshire Street.

In addition we request that funding be made available to address the flooding problem that occurs after heavy rain, this causes a road safety issue in an already heavily built up residential area. We do not think that a trade off of funding for **either** Living street or remedial work for the flooding should be explored. Both issues need to be addressed from separate and appropriate budgets.

**Wainoni Park**

Thanks to the Council for the intensive planning and consultation that has taken place for the Wainoni park development. The community has been very positive about the proposed changes, the proposed ablutions block and changing room will mean that sports teams can once more return and use this wonderful community amenity.
