Ratepayers write to you with concerns about city council spending, but I have yet to see any comment on the \$53.71 million proposed for a new council office building. It may be that citizens are not generally aware of this proposal, tucked without further comment into the draft community plan at page 29, volume 1.

But surely, so major a piece of expenditure requires widespread debate?

We are told by councillors that the ocean outfall places a severe strain on finances and that there is no money for smaller initiatives like household collection of organic waste. Why then is there the money for the bureaucracy that is unable to deliver the projects on the ground?

Why cannot the council support its own inner-city revitalisation by reuse of the many existing empty buildings?

Ratepayers can make submissions on this proposal until May 6, but more important is for the community to ask questions and make sure this gigantic project becomes an election issue.
