I wish to object on behalf of myself and fellow rural residents on your proposed changes from Rural to Residential rating.

Personally I find your whole process flawed and ludicrous. The basis of change (as per your letter) is by way of an aerial photograph of my property. The council has evidently identified by an aerial photo 289 properties from the total rural ratepayers as qualifying for the proposed change.

I would point out the house size, gardens and lawn area are the same since shifting and building some 23 years ago. The only building improvements being car garages and a small hobby cottage all within the original garden boundaries. My crime (for a rate increase) as shown by the aerial photo was to plant trees, garden and beautify the original rural environment. Apart from our rural/farming lifestyle our biggest thrill to date is the return of a wide variety of native birds including nesting Fantails. The birds are living in our garden supported over winter by the orchard we planted to provide a food supply. If you are brainstorming for increase revenue ideas you could consider a Fantail Tax for rural properties harbouring the birds. I would plead guilty and gladly pay your levy. I find your ad hoc rating change logic, based on a photo and obvious ground improvements and not seeking qualification of rural activities, totally flawed given Christchurch's slogan "the garden city, the city that shines".

When querying the validity and rationale I was told very strongly because I had improved the property mainly beautifying the gardens inside the boundaries I should pay the same rates as in the city. To quote Wayne Hann "Bollocks, I say you're not rural and should pay the same rates as Merivale". From that I take it that if I neglected and did nothing to the property then the rating increase charge would not apply!

I was also told this was "not a revenue grabbing exercise because our budgets and income were already done". I would like to know where our increase rates dollars are to be allocated. I presume the Square needs another makeover due to past/present councillors flawed decision making as documented by countless Press articles, and as always paid for by us ratepayers.

Attached (A – for Art, the Press 24.04.2004) headline "Christchurch puts last payment on wrapping paper" (1). A subjective investment of \$250,000 on Philip Trusttum's Convention Centre mural. Councillors Corbett (quote "99c a roll wrapping paper"), Austin (quote "a stunning work"), and Anderton all had personal views on the "investment" but I question Councilor Anderton's quote "I don't know about art but trust the people who do". I would remind Councillor Anderton in the dark ages councils lead by the intelligentsia trusted by earnest councillors believed the earth was flat and the 'Round Earth Citizens' who's taxes help pay the council were burnt at the stake for heresy. So much for trust. The last paragraph in this article quotes Art Director Warren Feeney "it's a magnificent artwork in all senses of the word: large in scale, rich in its iconography, and a genuinely joyful aesthetic experience"

- And it's paid for. -

I would like to add to the last line "And it's paid for by Rate Payers and Round Earth Citizens".

I would like clarification on the council's position if all the 289 rural properties are classified Residential then surely we can subdivide and the residential criteria for such would apply.

I also questioned the methodology to arrive at 289 from all rural ratepayers and was told "we had to start somewhere" and "yes after this we may look at all rural properties". In fairness to Wayne Hann I found him to be direct, helpful and honest in all my discussions and providing the rates details below.

Presently I own 10 head of cattle, 2 horses, 5 hens, a rooster, one cat 'fluffy' and one dog 'puppy'. I have bred, raced and sold horses successfully from this property. The property is spilt into 4 paddocks with horseboxes and yards. I currently have bought and stored 400 bales of hay for my rural activities over the coming winter. Proof of horse racing, breeding and yearling sales attached (2 & 3).

I find it galling in your letter that you say even though I am outside the sewerage/water area this is no longer a valid consideration. Wayne Hann advised me on my current valuation the following:

I don't pay water rates (\$189.41). However my well will be dry this summer due to falling water levels and needs to be replaced. This is due to other local bodies allowing the rape of Canterbury's water resource. A new well, pumps etc that has to be sunk before the summer levels fall are in excess of \$10,000 (as quoted by Mike Taylor Water Specialist). I will gladly pay \$189.41 for water at the gate!

Being Rural I also don't pay:

 Sewerage \$350.38 Storm Drain \$177.77 Service \$182.61 \$710.76 Total

Please Please bring the sewerage, footpaths, drainage etc to my rural gate for \$710.76 a year as in Merivale.

What suddenly made sewerage no longer a valid consideration for a rural differential. The legality and logic of this arbitrary decision escapes me and I can only surmise again that this exercise against 289 ratepayers is a money grabbing moment of madness by a council determined to spend other peoples money on grand projects beyond it's mandate. The Press (19th February 2004) headline "Council wears \$1 million tax bungle"(4). As a business owner I agree with Councillor Barbara Stewart's objection to council/us paying CEDF's tax bill of \$307,000 "I find it unacceptable the trust was guilty of a fundamental business error somewhere along the line they should have to pick up the problem not us. Possibly the Council's Development Corporation could use some more highly paid consultants/executives to scheme and waste my 30.35% rate increase. The basis of this 30.35% increase is solely on your ratepayer 23510 24700 RTZ 2281369 planting trees, garden and adding natures beauty to Christchurch 'The city that shines'. If this outrage goes ahead I suggest a new logo - Christchurch The Garden City 'The city that fines'.



Christchurch puts last payment on 'wrapping paper'

Christchurch is now the proud owner of the mega-mural Passport to the New Millennium which hangs on the west wall of the Convention Centre

The final payment was made on Thursday for the controversial 84m wide, \$250,000 public artwork by Philip Trusttum.

The mural raised a storm in 1999 then the Christchurch City Council reed to pay the \$50,000 deposit.

with the balance to be sought from grants and public subscriptions over five years.

While art experts gave it the thumbs up, councillor Barry Corbett was loud in his condemnation.

The self-confessed Philistine compared the work to "a 99c roll of gift wrap" he had used earlier that

"At 99c a roll. I figure you could get the same effect for about \$19.80," Corbett said then.

Corbett yesterday stood by his comments.

"It's amazing how long it has taken to buy a few rolls of wrapping paper. The more I see it, the fewer redeeming features I see."

He said many people had supported his view over the past five years. Like him, they were "sick of all this politically correct rubbish".

Cr Carole Anderton also calls herself a Philistine but harbours the opposite view.

The long wall could have looked "tacky" without the mural, Anderton said.

"It gives the building class. It is a notable work and in keeping for a place where huge numbers of people from all over the world come. I don't know about art but I trust the people who do."

For art-loving Cr Paddy Austin the mural is "a stunning work".

"Every time I go there I see new things in it - interesting, quirky

And it's paid for.



The Christchurch City Council will spend \$307,000 bailing out an economic development fund after bungles over its tax status.

The Canterbury Economic Development Fund (CEDF) was landed with the unexpected bill after Inland Revenue determined tax was payable on about \$1m the council paid to the fund in the last financial year. The bill will be paid out of the council's surplus from the past six months.

The trustees overseeing the CEDF had initially received financial advice from external consultants that it would be granted tax-free charitable status by the IRD, and made grants before receiving confirmation. The fund was at the time chaired by Stuart Leck.

The CEDF distributes money set aside from the sale of the council's Orion assets to firms working on projects which contribute to the local economy and community. The fund is administered by the Canterbury Development Corporation (CDC) to keep it at arm's length from council and ensure grants are politically neutral.

The CDC has charitable status, as its aims are to stimulate economic development, but the IRD determined the CEDF could not be given charitable status because it would award grants directly to private businesses. The trust's new chairman, David Stock, directed media inquiries to the council's director of strategic investments, Bob Lineham.

Lineham said that while the blunder was disappointing, the council had decided to bail out the fund to enable it to carry out the work for which it had been established.

"We weren't responsible for this but we're the ones who have the ability to sort it out for them. They have money lined up for a number of worthy projects and if they have to deal with tax they can't use that." The council had some concerns but did not see the point in laying blame.

While it was a "valid question" whether the trust had acted hastily in operating the fund before charitable status had been confirmed, he had no doubts about the trust's competence. "The advice the fund was getting was that (getting charitable status) was a matter of routine. They thought approval was forthcoming, so in the meantime they started operating."

To the best of his knowledge, the CDC was retaining the services of the consultants. "The advice was genuinely given. It's not a case of blaming consultants but rather the strong position taken by Inland Revenue."

Cr Barbara Stewart said she objected to the council footing the bill for the trust's blunder. "That's a considerable amount of money to come back to council. I find it unacceptable." The trust was guilty of a fundamental business error.

"They were impatient, they didn't wait. That's not a good way to go about business.

"Somewhere along the line, they should have to pick up the problem, not us."

Cr Barry Corbett was critical of the IRD's stance. "Why are the Government trying to grab money that's to be used for economic development?

"To me, (economic development) is a good thing, that's only going to generate more tax for them eventually."
