

### SUBMISSION OF THE SUMMIT ROAD PROTECTION AUTHORITY

### Community Outcomes and Strategic Directions (pages 43-57)

While the Community Plan makes specific reference to diverse communities in terms of our people, there is no specific outcome or direction relating to the diversity of the City's physical and geographical features such as the:

- Coastline and Estuary.
- The Suburbs.
- The Central City.
- The Port Hills (and now Banks Peninsular).
- The Plains.

In particular, there is no specific reference to the value of the Port Hills as the visual backdrop of the urban City and their landscaping and recreational importance to the City's character and well being. Given that Parliament has seen fit to provide special legislation to protect the skyline of the Port Hills, recognition of the geographical diversity of the City within the Community plan, would seem desirable.

While the detail of the objectives and polices for the physical components of the City are rightly to be found in the City Plan prepared under the Resource Management Act, at the strategic level at least, they should also form an essential part of the Community Plan. It is these physical characteristics of the City that give rise to many of the Council's activities and programmes including those relating to City Development, Parks Open Spaces and Waterways, Regulatory Services, Streets and Transport and Wastewater. It is also these physical characteristics that largely define many of the costs associated with these activities.

Specific recognition is sought of the City's geographical diversity within the Community Outcomes and Strategic Directions (pages 43-57) of the Community Plan.
