page 4, Major Projects

1. Proposed new civic offices : grossly increased cost of \$111 million is unacceptable so I oppose it and anything budgeted for "fit-out" for them.
2. New bus exchange : I want much more detail re why the current bus exchange is unsuitable, and a steady shooting option, before I support \$59 million expenditure.
3. Art Gallery air conditioning \$0.2 million : why is this necessary in such a new building? I oppose this.
4. Strategic assets : why have Red Bus lhd and City Care lhd been removed? I want to read the justification for this, and any criticism of it, before I decide whether or not to support it.
5. Avon River Central City strategy : I've seen a reference to this only in the last few days (early May) although I read all CCC publications + The Press. There's no time now to chase the detail so I oppose it at this stage.
6. Botanic Gardens project (same comment as for para 5)
7. City Mall renovation : not necessary - the footpath and paving just need cleaning to remove chewing gum and stains.
8. Central City Transport strategy : I support only the improvement of, and priority for, public transport, cycling and walking.

9. Waste Minimisation: I support this.
10. Strategic Land Purchase: I support this and ask that Moeraki Peninsula, especially the Quail Island end of it, be purchased to protect Quail Island and for the amenity value of Otago Harbour.
11. Biodiversity strategy: I support this and am shocked that it's not included, especially now that Banks Peninsula is part of CCC.
12. Water Re-use: I support this and believe it should have been included.
13. Bio-solids Drying Facility: I support this.
14. Tree Renewal: I support this.
15. New Leisure Centres: I oppose these without seeing further details. From them, I don't see these as high priority.
16. School Safety Zones: I support these.

page 8, Saving Money on Services

1. Community libraries: I oppose closure - we want to encourage, not discourage, literacy.
2. Use NZ Post for payments: I support this if a feasibility study shows it has merit.
3. CCC's publication City Scene: I'm not sure that it has much value. Who reads it?
4. Parking Charges: I support increases.
5. Cemetery Charges: I support increases.
6. Library Charges: Tighten up on compliance: better debt management, don't permit new debt or borrowing while debt exists. Refuse/cancel membership temporarily for those with history of debt. Send debts to collection agency earlier. Do credit checks on ^{prospective} new members?
7. Parking Charges: Tighten up on compliance. Collect parking fees. Don't send a second letter. Don't allow waivers (admin costs must be huge).

page 9, City Development

1. Solar heating: install on all new buildings
2. Rainwater collection + reuse
3. Urban Design: The City Plan is obviously weak in some areas + needs to be strengthened to prevent ugly streetscapes such as:
 - Baobadoes St and surrounding streets north of Bealeys Ave with hideous apartment complexes crammed into narrow sections;
 - East of Fitzgerald Ave to Stanmore Road, for a similar reason;
 - Proposed high-rise at Fernywood will be totally out of place as seen from Humphreys Drive and especially, against the Port Hills backdrop;
 - Proposed high-rise in Brighton, along Marine Parade.
4. City Plan: I want tighter controls, on height in particular, and also on bulk, shading and privacy.
5. Resource Consent: Too many controversial developments are non-notified. I want staff who decide these issues to err on the side of conservatism, with more ^{public} notifications.

6 Heritage : Council is merely paying lip service to conserving our heritage. Every year there are controversies over destruction of heritage buildings and wider streetscapes, for example:

- proposed change to Cæter's Beoir Musuem;
- an Avon hoop cottage being destroyed, to be replaced by a 3 storey house with a double garage at the front of the site;
- a heritage house with lime so, + thick, the Autarchie, on Clifton Hill.

7 Central City : I am always dismayed at the dirty footpaths and paving, not untidied with rubbish, but filthy with trodden-in chewing gum and apparently-unremovable stains. The Cathedral Square paving turned out to be an expensive disaster. I'd rather see it all in bitumen which is easily renewed.

8 Keffelham's London St : stormwater during heavy rain just runs across footpaths because drainpipes drain onto bare ground.

page 10, Community Development

1. Strategic Plan : There is ^{urgent} need for a long-term strategic plan.
2. Community Group Grants Review : I note a lack of early consultation prior to the draft LTCCP - a tight time-frame is no excuse.
3. Decision-making : I note a lack of community, including community board, input into decision-making.
4. Funding + Facilities Reviews : Should be delayed until strategy is in place.
5. Community Development management : something is very wrong here, at a high level. No strategic plan, no community consultation prior to this, yet lower-level reviews being carried out.

Page 11 Cultural + Learning Services

1. I use Central, South + Herwood libraries and think they are wonderful, except for increasing numbers of noisy pre-schoolers accompanied by, usually, their mothers. I want the librarians to ask the parent to quieten or to remove the child. The noise spoils it for me, whether browsing or using the computer.

Page 12 Democracy + governance

1. Consultation: why is this so important issue, legally required under the Local Government Amendment Act 2002, not mentioned on either page 7 or page 12?

As a Banks Peninsula resident, I am not familiar with CCC processes but my experience has been that:

- Community Board members attend residents association meetings;
- what the residents association committee (often as few as 5 people) wants is put into the Community Board's meeting agenda and actioned as if it was what the community wants;
- the Community Board's decisions are then documented in the meeting's minutes, which the community never gets to read;
- there's an outcry from the community when something of value (streetscape, trees, reserve, quiet) is destroyed months after the decision was made.

This process must not be regarded as consultation unless the residents association itself consults its members and, preferably, the wider community. My local residents association is the Dianwood Harbour Community Association and I know, from having been a committee member in 2001, that its constitution does not require it to consult. So, I want councillors and community board members to have regular clinics in their ^{local} area (the way members of parliament do), in their local hall, perhaps on Saturday mornings.

2. Decision-making : I object to elected members, without public consultation, going against CCC staff advice on issues. (For example, voting to exclude farm dogs from microchipping.) And hasn't the Auditor-General made some criticisms on previous council decision-making?

page 14 Parks, open spaces + waterways

1. ~~Unauthorised~~ Weed-Cutting in rural areas : rural + semi-rural areas, such as Diamond Harbour, do not need manicured reserves. The reason we live here is because of its semi-rural nature. I've been horrified to see reserves and Diamond Harbour Cemetery surrounds being regularly trimmed by a man with a weed-eater. This is time-consuming + therefore expensive and it leaves behind a mess of dead grass and seedheads. And for what purpose? It's not a fire risk. I accept that park + sportsfield lawns, cemeteries, and also roadsides, need mowing but that's enough.
2. Weedspraying roadsides in rural areas : if this is to be done, the dead remains must be removed + not just left to look unsightly, environmentally unfriendly and a fire risk during the summer.
3. Linwood Cemetery : There's obviously a plan for doing what you're doing but where is it? I see that ^{some} paths have been spread with fine pale yellow gravel - inappropriate in this setting. I note that a significant weed, with a fluffy

pale seedhead, is spreading north in the cemetery from its origin near Jollie St. Why hasn't this been dealt with over the years?

5. Biodiversity Protection: with Banks Peninsula. Now included, this needs to be enhanced with fencing and pest control.

6. Open drains : Either cover or install mesh safety nets in areas that have recently been of public concern.

2. ^{free} rubbish bags for the very ill : I oppose this. There is government assistance via WINZ for extra costs associated with poor health.
