SUBMISSION ON DRAFT COMMUNITY PLAN

The residents of the areas of Kainga, Spencerville and Brooklands have requested that our Association represent their views in this submission on the Draft Community Plan 2006 - 2016 Volume 1 for Public Consultation.

Hundreds of our residents have indicated their views of a part of the Plan by signing the enclosed petition which request that the Mobile Library be retained in this area.

Our location, on the outskirts of the city, and surrounded by rural land, means that unless there is a car available, it is impossible for residents to reach other libraries. The bus service to this part of town is only a token service catering mainly to commuter passengers.

The mobile library has been well supported by elderly folk, mothers with young families and non-drivers. This is their only source of library books and to deprive them of that education and entertainment to save what is really a paltry sum seems very short sighted. We are continually told that children should be encouraged to read rather than watch and this move to cut their access to books can only be detrimental to their education and reading ability.

We would also ask that the existing community libraries be retained for the same reasons.

Closing of suburban pools that communities have fundraised for years to build is also not supported by this Association. Children need pools in their areas so that they may learn to swim at an early age and enjoy the water.

We also disagree with cutting funding to organizations such as our own for Community activities. Often grants from the Community Boards are the only way that local groups can hold events such as Gala days and result in tremendous support from the local residents.

We appreciate that the measures that have been suggested are to avoid increasing the city rates beyond the proposed amount. It is the view of this Association that the cost of the proposed upgrading of the mall - is millions of dollars that would be better saved and applied to continuing these necessary services to the city. Beautifying projects such as this - should only be considered when there is sufficient funding to complete them without cutting existing services to the residents.

One area in our location that does need urgent work to avoid future flooding is the Brooklands Lagoon which was in urgent need of dredging 20 years ago when the last report was commissioned. This has not been done and the imminent danger from flooding through silting is now critical.

In conclusion, we believe this proposal to upgrade the mall and pay for it by cutting library services and shutting swimming pools is akin to a family buying an expensive statue for the garden and needing to cut off the power to pay for it.

We thank you for the opportunity of making this submission.
