Refugee Resettlement Support

Christchurch City Council Community Plan Submission.

Christchurch Resettlement Services Inc. [formerly Refugee Resettlement Support] is a local not-for-profit organization providing professional specialized resettlement services to refugees, new migrants and asylum seekers in Christchurch. The agency has been in operation for over twelve years, and was initially set up to enable 'local response to local needs' resettlement support.

Firstly I want to recognize the significant role that Christchurch City Council has played over the last 10 years in funding this agency, and in assisting local resettlement in general. Without this input the current levels of professional assistance to local resettling people would not be available.

There are two components to this submission:

1. One of the realities of working in the NGO sector is that national Government funding contracts generally target national priorities – not always local needs. This regularly leaves local community groups – like CRS - under funded to meet the needs of people in the local situation. At the same time, national Government contracts do not include the extra costs of providing multi-cultural services – these have to be fund raised for at a local level.

To this end, we would like the Christchurch City Council to continue supporting the work of community service organizations by way of funding assistance, so that agencies like CRS can provide services in Christchurch that meet the needs of people living here. We also request that this funding be provided on a three year funding cycle as is presently in place under the Annual Grants process, to enable strategic financial planning.

We believe there is a role for the Christchurch City Council to fund local resettlement work undertaken by CRS to ensure that the outcomes identified in the draft of the Community Plan 2006 are met in a professional and sustainable way for/with refugees and migrants resettling in the city.

The work undertaken by CRS builds the ability of individual resettling people and the capacity of local resettling communities to contribute to the community outcomes identified as inherently valuable to our city (page 6/7 of draft plan).

Some examples of the work undertaken by CRS in the last 3 years with CCC funding support:

- Work with refugee adolescents to ensure that they are able to access the same Christchurch services that mainstream youth access, and are able to make a positive contribution to their new community.
- Provision of professional support to adolescent refugees and their families when resettlement or family difficulties arise and assisting the young people with practical resettlement support (housing/education/employment).
- Maintaining access for non-English speaking pre-literate refugee women to appropriate ESOL/literacy/on-going orientation classes. This underpins improved settlement outcomes for the entire refugee family in relation to education and positive citizenship.
- Contributing to the provision of home to kindy/school transition support for refugee pre-school children to ensure that they have the best possible start at age 5 years.
- Supporting the provision of parenting programmes for local refugee communities to ensure that they have access to professional parenting education and understand New Zealand family law.

We believe it is important that Christchurch City Council continue its financial support of local community service provision groups. We would like to see this component retained in the Council's Community Plan.

2. We also urge Christchurch City Council to become an active funding stakeholder in the proposed new Christchurch Migrant Centre. This to house the current Refugee and Migrant Centre services together with other local refugee and migrant organizations (government and non-government). Such a centre would enable service providers and all resettling migrants to work collaboratively towards enhancing resettlement outcomes in Christchurch.
