Submission to Christchurch City Council re community plan draft 2006-2016

The work City Housing does in providing housing to people on low incomes with complex needs is highly appreciated. We acknowledge that the Christchurch City Council is the second largest social housing provider in New Zealand. However, reading the draft of the Council's Community Plan 2006-2016 has highlighted some concerns. The Gowerton Place Development is the only build the Council is considering in the next ten years and is to replace flats that will be lost when The Palms extends its carpark. It is a concern that with rising rents in the private market, the waiting list pressure experienced by Housing New Zealand, and the aging population, that the City Council is not investigating whether further housing provided through City Housing will be necessary within the next ten years. In addition, while a budget has been allocated for renewing and replacing existing housing, there is no detail as to how and where this money will be spent. The Council's Asset Management Plan does not seem to be available through the City Council's website. Many of the council's units, while maintained in good condition, are too small and unsuitable for the current population the Council houses. When the Council increased rents the increased revenue was to be used to upgrade and increase the size of some units. Is this type of work included in the Asset Management Plan?

We also have concerns regarding costs increases to developers in relation to NGO and local body housing. The extra costs may inhibit growth in this sector. We would wish for the needs of low income people in regards to housing to be taken into account when considering the impact of these decisions and request at least the possibility of exemptions for those developing non profit housing for low income people.

We would wish to make submissions on this, and on other matters regarding low income housing at appropriate future dates. Thank you for this opportunity to give feedback.
