- ① Do you have any comments on the major projects in our draft Our Community Plan? page number
- There seems to be a cutting of local facilities in favour of a bigger, flashier one some distance away. This is disadvantaging people who cannot afford the transport costs or the admission costs. These people are already disadvantaged. The people in Bromley want basic facilities in the local area at an affordable cost (which is usually \$2 per session at a centre as this is all they can afford). These people are having their phones cut off when the winter power bills come and many cannot afford heating.
- ② Do you have any comments on groups of activities (the activities and services that Council provides)? page number  99
- The community outcomes sound fine as do the goals and objectives but there is not much information about how these are to be achieved.
  - There is no information on the current performance of the 'satisfaction with quality of support provided to target community groups' or 'housing rental unit satisfaction'. How can these be measured when there is no baseline data?
  - Places such as community centres provide crucial community support for disadvantaged people in particular who need a friendly, welcoming, safe place to come and a skilled community worker to assist them. Some of these people suffer mental illness, are sick, live in poverty, have no transport and are in danger of being forgotten in the quest for a 'boutique city'.
- ③ Do you have any other comments or suggestions you want to make? page number
- Increase spending on local community resources such as community centres, libraries, pools.
  - If necessary cut spending on some festivals/events as it is more important for people to have their basic needs met (at present there are still too many people living in poverty).
  - Failure to provide for people who are living 'on the edge' and do not have 2 cars etc will mean an even bigger gap between the 'haves' and the 'have nots' and this will lead to increased crime etc.
