Page 6 of the Summary Community

We commend the Christchurch City Council on its past record of resourcing community groups and support the continued allocation of grants to groups which enables the CCC to achieve its goal of being a city of inclusive and diverse community.

Christchurch has a large number of community groups which creates opportunities for many people to participate and belong in the community.

We submit that the community libraries i.e. Redwood, Bishopdale and Spreydon should be retained as their lose would impact particularly on the elderly and people without transport. Local amenities allow people to participate in their local community.

We submit that people need basic amenities locally that they can utilise often rather than larger higher quality facilities that are further away ,cost more to get to and more to access.

Environment

To protect the natural environment we submit that the council creates a sustainable development approach using a quadruple bottom line to measure the sustainability for all proposed activities [economic,environmental, social,and sustainable] All should be explicit in decision making

Page 12 of the Summary Governance

We applaud the opportunity to participate in local government decision making but submit that more time is needed for consultation particularly in relation to the time frame around the LTCCP.

We submit that the CCC need to be transparent in its decision making particularly re strategic assets i.e. port, airport and bus companies

The Local Government Act 2002, section 14 [1][d] provides opportunities for Maori to contribute to its decision-making processes. It also [under Section 82] requires the Council to ensure that processes are in place for consultation with Maori. We submit that the LTCCP needs more detail in respect of its processes for consultation with all people who identify as Maori.
