page 10. Childcare/Early Learning should be provided for parents on benefits or on low income. The service should be not-for-profit. It may be that more than 16 centres or fewer are required. Parents need to be consulted before this program is expanded or reduced.

Page 14 Use money saved by gutting the above to upgrade popular walking tracks on the Port Hills. Employ more rangers to do above plus carry out education and compliance tasks. Restore the balance of service to walkers rather than bikers, or at least equalize it.

Page 18 Deal with severe traffic congestion at suburban malls. Barrington Mall is the scene of regular serious ^{accidents} which include cyclists and pedestrians. Note foot traffic in Barrington Street and install more pedestrian crossings and other ^{extent of} vehicle restrictions.

We ~~I~~ want the Council to consider the issue of **strategic assets** on page 294 of the LTCCP.

We ~~I~~ want the Council to list as strategic assets:

1. Its equity in CCHL and its equity holdings in the Lyttelton Port Company, City Care Ltd, and Red Bus Ltd.
2. The land and buildings as a whole owned by the Council for its public rental housing provision

We ~~I~~ strongly oppose the changes in the draft LTCCP to remove the above assets from the strategic asset list in the LTCCP.

The reasons for ^{our} ~~my~~ submission are that:

- The Council is undemocratically removing the public's right to have a say in the control of public assets by not listing the above.
- The public benefit of keeping these assets in public control is a huge positive for the city of Christchurch.
- ^{We} ~~I~~ do not believe it is in the best interests of the City to sell off public assets and allow foreign control of strategic assets. Overseas investors are attracted by profits and ~~do not~~ care about the well being of local people.

• The Council should note the protracted industrial action involving "Stagecoach" the privately owned bus company in Auckland and Wellington. This company purchased the majority of these cities' bus routes from publicly owned utilities. Now Stagecoach is selling up in N.Z. Red Bus and we the users, have hardly any industrial action. Customers + drivers are proud of a good service here. Leave it alone!
