Mr Mayor, Councillors,

Thank you for the opportunity to address you in the matter of the Long

Term Council Community Plan. My observations will be limited to the matter of

libraries.

- The monetary amounts saved are tiny in the overall picture of City rates.
 A very minor reduction from the budget for an Essential Project would easily fund continuing support of all libraries.
- 2. There is considerable population growth in the northern parts of the city which will be severely affected by the proposed loss of local facilities and would be scarcely mitigated by libraries at Papanui and Shirley where access is inconvenient and difficult,
- 3. It seems anomalous that closures are proposed following hard on the heels of extensive and expensive actions at Parklands, Riccarton and City South leading to the supposition that some areas of Christchurch are more deserving than others.
- 4. It is likely that closure of the indicated libraries would have an effect on other services and commercial activities in those areas. Patrons who would normally conduct other business in the "library area" will, when faced with seeking books and associated services elsewhere, find it convenient to pursue other matters near their source of books. For example, residents of Belfast may find it more suitable to patronise the Kaiapoi library, which, like the businesses in that town, is not a contributor to Christchurch City.

5. Two documents – "Strategic directions for the Canterbury Public Library 1997-2007" and "Strategic directions for Christchurch City libraries 2002-2007" offer many commendable objectives of which one will serve as an example. "Values – equity access and opportunity for all" While acknowledging the extensive provision of modern technology and wide ranging resources the potential abandonment of, for example, Redwood library will seriously disadvantage several sectors of the community. Those who, because of disability, lack of personal transport or the necessity to manage the young and infirm, will face considerable obstacles in obtaining access to the abundance of resources offered.

Intellectual capital may be available but NOT ALWAYS WHERE IT IS USEFUL.

The claim that Christchurch provides wide-ranging cultural and educational opportunities is certainly justified but please do not lessen the convenience of access for all of us by implementing the miniscule economies which may be achieved in removing local libraries.

Without pursuing the matters of large ticket items in the City budget and the justification or otherwise of implementing those it is vital that our city does not build empires to the detriment of our cultural wellbeing nor that commercial entities are deprived of significant alliances.

PLEASE LET US KEEP OUR LIBRARIES.
