Attached item to Submission on Community Plan.

We object to the proposal to close Bishopdale, Redwood and Spreydon Libraries and cease operation of the mobile library.

As well as being the closest to us, the Bishopdale Library serves expanding housing development in the upper Harewood and Sawyers Arms Roads area.

It will soon be joined by a new YMCA recreation centre and has ample car parking nearby.

We expect that the Redwood library is used by those living in the Northwood and Regents Park subdivisions.

The savings expected to be made by these closures – about \$450, 000 and \$80,000 for the mobile library – seem very small in comparison with the \$10.3 million dollars proposed for renovation of City Mall (despite contributions from rating), a project which would contribute little to educational and recreational activities.
