Submission on draft 2006 to 2016 Community Plan

As the Museum's Annual Plan is not in the broader public arena, the city's ten-year Community Plan is the only chance that the public has of understanding what is achieved with the support of Council's large annual grant to the Museum.

The cost of the proposed cultural and learning services, as set out on page 107 of the full plan, shows that, over the next ten years, the Council's plans to spend approximately the same amount of money on the Christchurch Art Gallery as on Canterbury Museum. We suggest that the citizens of Christchurch could expect to see equal justification in terms of measures and targets for the two organisations.

Our submissions are as follows:

Page 11 of the summary draft plan

That at least one Museum-related achievement be added after the two pertaining to the Christchurch Art Gallery, eg achieve 750,000 visits to Canterbury Museum costing \$9.46 each in 2009/10.

Page 105 of Volume I of the full draft plan

That at least one Museum-related achievement be added to the Measures and Targets to complement the two pertaining to the Art Gallery, eg:

^{*} These targets assume that the next major, two-and-a-half-year phase of the Museum's Revitalisation Project will commence in early 2007 with the new circulation spine becoming operational in July 2009.
